In February, we hosted our first I ♥ Tia event at the Arizona Biltmore. The Brophy VEAs, Ryan, Ayaan and John, spoke most eloquently about their experiences. In late spring, early summer, we did a project in San Pedro Itzican, Jalisco and we were joined in the field by renowned photojournalist Kathy McCraine and Tia Board Member Katie Smith. This was a particularly bittersweet project for all of us. The effects of extreme water contamination were visible in nearly everyone we met: neurological damage, thinning hair, birth defects. We made sure that not only did Tia Promotoras learn how to make water filtration systems with items found in every home, but we spread out and with the help of the dedicated Promotoras, like community leader Anita, made sure that many of the households were equipped to do the same.

Near the end of August, we hired our first Medical Director, Dr. Roberto Martinez Ibarraran. Laura was in dire need of help in country as the number of Promotoras and villages had grown over the years. Dr. Roberto was the natural choice. He had been on Tia brigades when he was a medical student, then later as a professor of medicine. He loves field work and has a way of putting our villagers at ease with his wonderful sense of humor and his encouragement with the Pro-

motoras. He explains the curriculum in a manner that they can grasp and remember. We are very fortunate indeed to have such a brilliant doctor join our ranks!

In September, there was a magnitude **7.1 earthquake** that struck just south of Mexico City and shook violently for about 20 seconds. **Dr. Raymundo Avila and Dr. Diego Alcocer formed volunteer brigades.** Each brigade went to help out and provide medical care at the quake-site. Dr. Ray's group worked in Mexico City, while Dr. Diego went to the nearby State of Morelos.

We rounded out our year with our last project in **Atotonilco El Alto**, Jalisco. Dr. Roberto had a great idea! In addition to our Promotoras coursework, we created some breakout sessions for police and paramedics who need only a refresher on the basics but are interested in learning new skills. The emergency professionals loved it and the Promotoras still received all their training and special attention.

As of the end of 2017, we have covered so much geography in Mexico that we cannot fit all of our project site push pins on one map! The map to the right shows **most of our sites** in **West Central Mexico**, primarily in Jalisco and Colima and we are in other states too! Thank you for helping us reach so many!

We won't be resting on our laurels. We have big plans for 2018.
