This March, the Tia Foundation completed a project in Magdalena, Jalisco. During this project, we trained 23 Community Health Workers that will provide care for over 24,000 people.

This July, we brought three volunteers to our project in the beautiful municipality of Tapalpa, Jalisco. 38 Community Health Workers graduated from Tia's course, including the Presidenta of the municipality. Our volunteers helped to pack medical kits, recorded community health data on our Tia's new survey app, and even helped to treat a man with a severe fungal infection. After the graduation ceremony, the volunteers and the brigade returned to Guadalajara for a party to celebrate a successful project and reaching half a million people.

The Tia Foundation just returned from it's project in Yahualica, Jalisco. During this trip, we added 38 new Community Health Workers and

Three volunteers joined us in the field

46,000 people received sustainable healthcare for life. Many of the health outposts or "Casas de Salud" in this municipality have been completely abandoned. One had not had a visit from a doctor for over 30 years. The lack of essential services allowed illnesses in the community to go undiagnosed for decades. During our free public health consultations, we identified a young boy who is on the autism spectrum as well as deaf and connected him and his family with resources to help. We treated another boy who came to the consultations. complaining of tingly arms and legs. Soon after our doctors realized that something was very wrong. After an examination, it was uncovered that half of his heart had not


been functioning for quite some time. Our doctors are helping him to plan a course of treatment for his condition.

Our next project will be in the rural municipality of Tamazula, Jalisco. This municipality is a few hours south of Guadalajara and has about 23,000 residents. Tamazula is Nahuatl word for "lagoon of toads". The municipality is a large producer of sugar cane that is primarily used for making alcohol. Famous for their salsa picante, you may have seen Tamazula in your local grocery store. The town of Tamazula is also a famous destination for the religious and music festival of, Our Lady of Sagrario.

After more than 15 years of work and with the help of so









many people, we have reached our goal of providing over half a million people with free life-long healthcare by 2021. This year, Tia has also trained our one-thousandth Community Health Worker. We have brought healthcare to 33 municipalities in 5 states. We have helped fight H1N1, Zika, and COVID-19 in some of the hardest to reach communities in Latin America. It has been wonderful to share this journey with our supporters, and we are just getting started.
