Fausta's Story

Jorge Humberto, a Promotor, visited Fausta, a woman in her 90s living alone in San Isidro. Despite her age, Fausta kept her home spotless and full of spirit. Her toenails, neglected for years, had become severely overgrown. With help from Temoc and America, her nails were carefully trimmed as she sang. Jorge ensured she had ongoing support, as her family abroad could not help.

A Life-Saving Intervention

A gentleman with dangerously infected leg ulcers was treated during our trip. Temoc and America cleaned the wounds and removed debris while Agueda, another Promotora, monitored his recovery. He was given medicine and supplies to continue treatment, ensuring his condition improved safely.

Supporting the Youth

In San Isidro, a middle school teacher brought her class for medical check-ups. Many students had fungal infections on their hands and feet. The teacher ensured they received treatment, nutritional counseling, and psychological support, recognizing the importance of mental health in their recovery.
